She addressed the problem of corrective feedback from both points of view - giving & receiving. Starting a Difficult Conversation presents it challenges as timing is essential to make sure everyone is calm. Stating the facts, feelings, impact and needs provides the best information possible and alternative avenues in behavior as well. Requesting a response or feedback during the conversation not only reassures the listener that you are interested with their point of view. Make expressions like "Wow, you seem frustrated" and paraphrasing the response clears any misconceptions or confusions.
